3 Types:

- Denied Claims
 - Factual basis
- Admitted Claims
 - Body part and indemnity issues
- Combined Claims
 - Admitted and denied (heart and back)

Routes to Settlement

1. Continue Discovery
 - Depositions, medical records, Med-Legal evaluations
2. Stipulated Award
 - Disability and medical
3. Compromise and Release
 - Resolution of Everything
4. Creative Compromise and Release
 - Resolution of Limited Issues

Who is in the Car?

- Present ongoing employee
- Former employee
- Soon-to-be former employee – retirement or resignation
- Long-term employee
- Bad actor employee

Risk Tolerance

- Settlement authority limits
- Council approval
- Union involvement
- Budget constraints

Risk Tolerance

- Claim cost projections based on current information
- The cost of obtaining additional information
- How will the additional information affect the settlement value?

The Employee

- What are the specific issues or barriers for this individual?
- How do you discern the issues?
- Creative solutions

Effective Claim Reviews

- What claims are reviewed?
 - Age
 - Reserves
 - Noise level
- How do you clarify settlement options at all stages of the claim?
 - Is the linear handling necessary?

Excess Involvement

- Awareness of excess reporting levels and involvement

- Structured settlement
